Restricted A3 usage limiting the business to reheating food only in a microwave as described in the application.

Reason: To ensure that unsatisfactory cooking odours outside the premises are minimised in the interests of the amenity of the area and occupiers of nearby properties.

## Refuse provision

The applicant has detailed how refuse from the food premises is to be disposed of. The designated, secure bin storage area is to be located on the applicant's land to the rear of 259 Epping High Street.

Reason: In order to protect the amenity of the area from rubbish generated on the site.
