The Ongar Health Centre cannot cope since The Ongar Surgery closed therefore they would not be able to manage the significant increase in population that has been proposed. Whilst provision may be made for local employment the reality is that most new residents will work in London and will need to commute. The trains are too crowded as it is and parking at local stations is almost impossible after 7.30 in the morning. All roads into London are already extremely congested on a daily basis and it appears there are plans to alleviate the already existing problems.

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8. An Interim Sustainability Appraisal has been commissioned to support the Draft Local Plan. We would welcome any comments you may have on this.

The future of the only major hospital in the area is uncertain. No development should be undertaken until there are adequate hospital facilities in place not just proposed - plans for the future will not save lives. The congestion that already exists in Ongar needs to be addressed prior to any housing development. Green Belt and open green areas need to be preserved as do areas of historic interest. Whilst the plan states as aims the rest of the plan is contradictory and does not support the aims and objectives.

Throughout the plan it states that one of the aims is to provide affordable housing. The word affordable is only relative to the income of the would-be buyer of a new property. Even if guidelines or restrictions are imposed in order to aim for reasonably priced homes, all property developers will aim to maximise their profits. This is a fact known by all and should be recognised. All Epping Forest District residents are aware of this. If the Government really want to create employment and affordable housing, plans need to be made to encourage industry to the Midlands and North of England.

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
