map 2.3 provides inadequate and incorrect information to the general public about the area designated for residential development. Existing residential homes are highlighted for proposed development. There is no allocation for green space whatsoever. An appendix 6 is mentioned at the bottom of the map, but none exists on line.

There is no evidence of participation of the local community and others having a stake in the area. The residents directly affected by the development proposals, (Old House lane and Epping Road), although informed by EFDC, have not been given the opportunity to engage directly with the planning department on a local level. The planning department has never once arranged to meet residents locally to discuss their views. All correspondence is carried out at a distance and based on EFDC prepared questions and answers.

The proposal to develop on green belt and within a conservation area is not consistent with national policy. The proposal also destroys the landscape character of the area and threatens the national collection of black poplar trees. The plan states that it wishes to prevent unrestricted sprawl and prevent the merging of settlements. If map 2.3 is correct, the settlements of Harlow and Roydon hamlet will merge.
