Dear Sirs,

Epping Forest District Local Plan

I read, with some concern, proposals for the release of Green Belt land for housing development in Shoering village. Articles in Shoering News (edition 126, December 2016, received today) are the first direct notification that I - and presumably many other Sheering residents - have received of these plans and the December 12 time limit for submissions.

My particular concern relates to the block of land SR-0033 (Figure 5.27, Site allocations for Sheering, in the Local Plan), which lies directly to the East and North of my house and garden, Quinces. The Street. Applications for housing development on the field abutting The Street (B183), that forms the greater part of SR-0033, have been refused on several occasions, including 1952, 1966 and 1986.

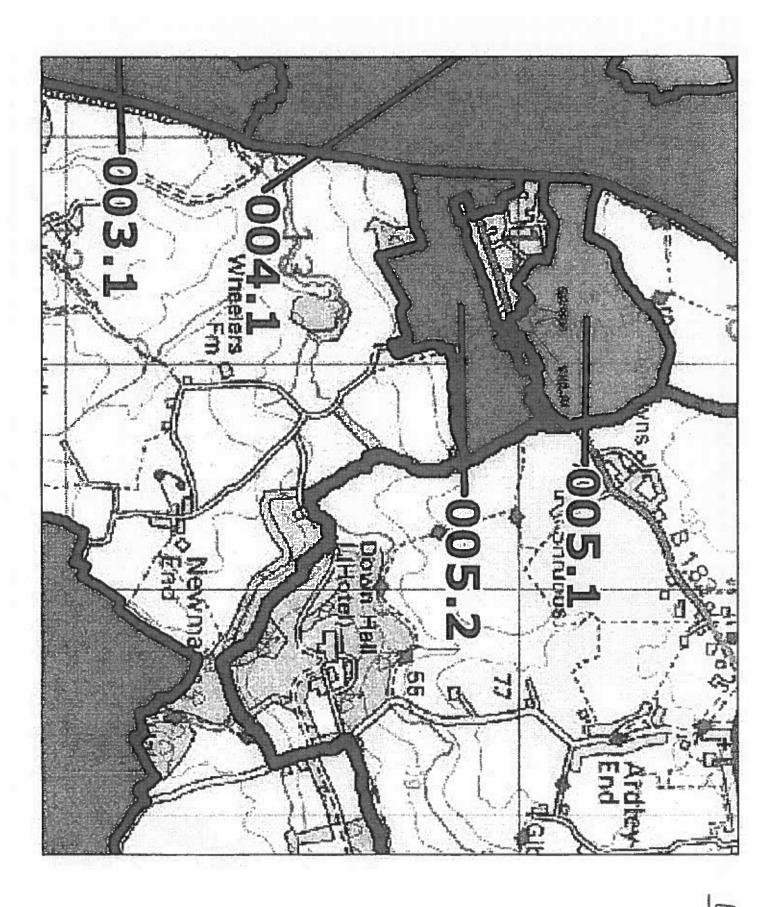
I objected to the 1986 application on the grounds that further housing development on land beside The Street would mar the local character of Sheering, that the development would add to vehicular traffic along The Street, with all the concomitant dangers and inconvenience outlined by Mrs Linda Ainsworth in her comments in December's Sheering News (p6 – copy attached), and that housing on the field in question would overlook my house and garden, eroding the privacy currently enjoyed by my family. The proposed site allocation now extends the threat of housing development to the smaller rectangle of land to the North West of SR-0033, the field to the rear of my property, the effect of which is that my house and garden will be surrounded by development on all sides, with implications for the peaceful enjoyment – and market value - of Quinces. Further, I would point out that the electricity sub-station at the South-West corner of SR-0033 would constitute a hazard to residential housing. Adventurous children will always climb fences, even if discouraged by warning notices and reinforced barriers.

These remain my concerns and I would respectfully propose that the proposed release of block SR-0033 from the Green Belt is removed from the Local Plan.

I write with reference to the proposed inclusion of Land at Daubneys Farm (SHR.R1) in The Local Plan (Submission Version 2017), hereafter referred to as LPSV 2017, with the request that the proposed site allocation of SHR.R1 is excluded from The Local Plan. Firstly, I note that the Green Belt boundary shown in LPSV 2017 has been moved so as to include SHR.R1 within the village
envelope. Surely, boundary changes to the Green Belt have yet to be finally determined? I previously wrote to you on 6 December 2016 (copy letter attached, Exhibit 1) expressing my particular concern about the site allocation of block SR-0033 in the Draft Local Plan (2016). I am relieved to see that a part of block SR-0033 has been removed from
the LPSV 2017 proposals.
Chapter 1 of LPSV 2017, Introduction, Key Issues for the Pfan to Address, includes section 1.44 point 4 the continued protection of the Green Belt, and refers on to chapter 2, Section 2.134 (p56) Key Evidence, the Green Belt Review (Land Use Consultants 2016), hereafter referred to as GBRLUC 2016. Doubtless, a critical reason for excluding part of block SR-0033 from the LPSV 2017 proposals was the assessment of Green Belt parcels in GBRLUC 2016, where the harm to the Green Belt from releasing land in parcel 5.001 for development was assessed as High. I have attached (as Exhibit 2) detail from the map in GBRLUC 2016, showing parcel 005.1 which takes in all of block SR-0033 from the Draft Local Plan 2016 and block SRR. RI from LPSV 2017. I submit that the surmary assessment ratings applying to parcel 005.1 apply equally to SHR.RI - which forms part of block SR-0033 - as they do to the part of SR-0033 that has been removed from the Local Plan proposals. Exclusion of one part of SR-0033 should apply equally to
the remainder of SR-0033, i.e. site allocation SHR.R1 I therefore respectfully request that proposed site allocation SHR.R1 be removed from The Local Plan proposals, in order to render the
