Policy SP 6 - Green Belt and District Open Land

- Over 92% of Epping Forest is designated as Green Belt, and it has been a long held view of the Council that a review of the Green Belt boundary would be necessary in order to accommodate long term development needs.
- We support the Council's policies and proposals with regard to the Green Belt and, in particular, the principle of altering the Green Belt boundary to allow the allocation of strategic sites around Harlow.
- As stated in paragraph 2.135 of the Plan, the NPPF requires that exceptional circumstances are demonstrated to justify any alteration to the Green Belt boundary. It is important to recognise that the exceptional circumstances are most clearly evident and compelling where the level of need for development is acute.
- We support the justification for altering the Green Belt boundaries as summarised in paragraph 2.136 of the Plan. We consider that the overall need for growth and regeneration at Harlow also constitutes exceptional circumstances that justify Green Belt alteration. The needs of Harlow are clearly set out in paragraph 2.140 of the Plan and we think it would be helpful to define these needs as exceptional circumstances.
- Map 2.5 of the Plan illustrates the Green Belt Boundary Alterations, with the detailed boundaries and inset settlements defined in Chapter 5 of the Plan and shown on the policies map. For the reasons discussed in Section 5 in respect of Policy SP5, we consider that the Green Belt boundary adjoining Latton Priory should be moved further south, as the proposed Green Belt boundary does not align with 1) the boundary of the residential site allocation or 2) with a permanent recognisable boundary as required by paragraph 85 of the NPPF.
- We question the appropriateness of developing on Green Open Spaces within existing settlements and note in particular the proposals in this respect for Loughton. The proposed Garden Town Communities at Harlow and Latton Priory in particular, provide opportunities to increase housing capacity overall within the District and remove the need for the development of green spaces in the Epping Forest main settlements.
