Letter or Email Response:

I am writing against your proposals to build 195 houses on Jessel green. I live nearby onRedacted.... and feel that it would be a travesty if this went ahead. It is vital for the physical and mental health of local residents that Jessel Green is kept as a green, open space. I run a local breast feeding group. Every single mum that I support has told me how vital Jessel Green had been for their positive mental health. New mums are often at risk of postnatal illness. Being able to access a local, green space such as Jessel Green has enormous health benefits for these new mums. Other unused brownfield sites would be a much better alternative to the housing needs of the area, such as those on Langston road. There are also underused allotment sites that would be more appropriate, rather than recreational sites that everyone uses. From a logistical point of view, the area around Jessel Green cannot cope with an increase of housing on this level. I have two children at Hereward Primary school, which is a heavily oversubscribed school, even after recently being expanded. Our local doctors surgery, the Forest Practice would struggle to cope with extra patients. This an extremely ill thought out plan by peopleRedacted.... and do not understand the problems that it would cause. I strongly object to these plans and hope that common sense can prevail.
