I commute to London on the Central Line, at between 7.15 and 7.30am. Last year more trains were introduced but already carriages now arrive full, this will become worse once the development on the site on the Old Winston Churchill is completed and more residential developments will put more stress on the service. 2 Staples Road School has an intake of 100 pupils a year, last September double the number of pupils applied for a place. This is taking into consideration the fact many parents send their children to private prep schools nearby, reducing what could potentially be an even greater number of children applying. 3 Green spaces are what make Loughton a wonderful environment to live in.
